Message from Becky Ricketts, Deputy Headteacher

It was wonderful last half term watching students return to specialist spaces and teachers being able to be in their own rooms. What has also been lovely is to see our year groups working and playing alongside each other and it has reinforced how important this is in children's development as they look to older role models or seek to support younger students. This week a student, who sometimes struggles with form time, told a member of staff that he had to stay because it was 'ELF Day' and he preferred spending time with the ELFs than having time out of form; I think this epitomises how important it is for our younger students to have that time with their older peers and the positive impact it can have on them.

Next week (11/11/21) we are looking forward to opening our school once again for our Sixth Form Open Evening and hope you will be able to attend. Our ELFs and Diana Award Ambassadors are also busy working with Mrs Sadler and Mrs Killington on activities for Anti Bullying Week the following week.

As a polite reminder, period 1 starts at 8:30 am and students are expected to be in their classroom by this time. I do appreciate the challenges of motivating a teenager to be up and out of the house on time and also the current challenges with road works in the area, but please can I ask that you do encourage and support your child to be in school by 8:25 am so that they are in their classrooms ready to learn. If students are arriving 5 minutes late every morning, they are missing half a lesson every week. Over the course of a term this equates to a day and half of missed lessons and, over a year, over four days worth of missed lessons. Timekeeping is also a key life skill that our students need to develop as they enter the world of work.

I know some parents have expressed concerns about the temperature within classrooms this week and have asked whether the school will allow students to wear coats within the rooms. Firstly, I want to assure you that we do take the wellbeing of our students very seriously and do not want anyone to be uncomfortable due to the environment in which they are working. We do recommend that all students should come into school with layers of clothing. It is advised that the most effective way to protect yourself from the cold is to wear multiple layers which can be added or removed depending on the conditions. Since returning to school some students are continuing to come in with just a school shirt and a coat; we would advise against this and encourage them to attend in layers including the school jumper.

If you are unable to purchase a school jumper or a school uniform item, please contact your child's Head of Year and we will look as to how we can support you with this matter.

Staff have also been advised to only have one window open during lessons and ideally choose a window that is not directly near a student. They will then open all windows during social times to increase ventilation. Unlike last year, we are also no longer having to have all external doors open which means the temperature within the rooms is remaining much warmer than previously. As a school, we are following this guidance from County regarding cooler weather:

- windows are fully opened before rooms are occupied and during breaks
- windows are kept partially open when rooms are in use, windows are selected that are not directly next to work areas/pupils' desks or high-level windows are open fully and low level opened partially
- information has been provided to parents, carers and pupils to dress appropriately for cooler temperatures

I do appreciate that for some students they will still feel the need to wear a coat and as a school we will support this providing that they are dressed in layers and in full school uniform. We will not permit hoodies, other than the ones with the school logo, as either an alternative to a school jumper or as a winter coat. Students will be asked to remove these if they attend school in them. We will also not permit hats, or hoods to be worn up, in lessons. As we are compromising on our coat expectation within the classroom, I politely request that you also support us by not allowing your child to come into school with a non-school uniform hoodie or other non-school uniform items.

We currently have a lot of unclaimed uniform items at reception. If your child is missing anything, please direct them to come to reception to check. Can we also request that school items are clearly labelled and named. We also have some second hand uniform available to purchase.

If you are going to Bonfire Night displays this weekend, I hope that the weather stays kind for you.


