# Message from Gareth Yassin, Deputy Headteacher

I will start with the disappointing news and get that out of the way. With much sadness we have had to cancel the Christmas fair planned for next Thursday 16 December. There has been an awful lot of work gone into planning the event, ensuring festive refreshments are available, liaising with 50 stallholders and catering providers; it was shaping up to be a fantastic community event and a lovely way to celebrate the end of the year together. Alas, we have, once again, been bested by Covid and, with cases of the new variant increasing nationally, it seems most sensible to cancel this event to keep everyone safe. Looks like I'll have to shop elsewhere for Mrs Yassin's presents! We hope we may be able to coordinate a similar event in the spring term but perhaps with a less 'Christmassy' feel!

The forthcoming week will start to feel decidedly Christmassy in places, with the ever-popular Christmas lunch on Wednesday. We hope as many students as possible will come to school in a Christmas jumper to help create some festive cheer – a reminder that even if they are not eating the Christmas lunch, students are welcome to wear a Christmas jumper and there are no donations required for this. On Friday, school will finish at 2pm after an extended form time where students will be partaking in Christmas quizzes and similar celebratory activities.

Our thanks for all your contributions to this year's school Food Bank appeal, organized by the Sixth Form Leadership Team. It's not too late if you have items to bring in – sixth formers will be collecting all the donations on Monday 13 December. This week has been another fantastic week at school. Students remain focused in lessons even as we approach the end of term. Due to the standard increase in seasonal illnesses that we are seeing at the moment, there has been a slight increase in covered lessons this week, with teaching staff giving up lots of their time to support classes by teaching additional hours.

I am grateful to all staff who have helped out in this way this week, as well as to students who have behaved maturely and considerately in supporting colleagues who may be teaching unfamiliar topics or in different rooms – a real community effort.

On Wednesday evening we conducted our second Parent Forum of the year, with workshops on GCSE English, GCSE Science, GCSE Maths, Internet Safety and Preparing for Sixth Form. My thanks to all families who attended and to staff who gave up their time to host the workshops.

After the Christmas break, the Year 9 options process starts properly and throughout January there will be opportunities for students and families to find out more about the subject choices available to them. This will start with the options booklet which will be followed up by Parents' Evening for Year 9s, then finally our options evening event in early February where families will get to discuss courses with teachers. We are hopeful that this will be a face-to-face event, but will of course keep families updated as we get closer to the date.

In a similar vein, after Christmas, I will be putting the options blocking pattern together for next year's Year 12 A-level courses. Could I remind all Year 11s that if they are considering joining our fantastic and highachieving Sixth Form in September, they need to hand their application form in before Christmas and choose us as their first-choice destination, to guarantee that their preferred combination of options will be considered in planning.

- Continuing our coverage of the rowing successes of Will B in Year 11, last weekend he travelled to Hampton to race in the Small Boats Head. Incredibly, but unsurprisingly, Will won his race at J16 1x single scull! The entry included many high-profile schools and clubs with a total of 39 entries. Well done, Will!
- In November, some of our Year 7s took part in the 'Bebras challenge' during their computing lessons, which is a world-wide challenge that introduces logic and computational thinking. All students applied themselves really well, producing some great scores. Bebras award a gold certificate to the top 10% of scorers nationally and this group achieved seven of those, so a massive well done to Cody J, Elspeth H, Ethan L, James R, Douglas Y, Abe W and Isaac C. Isaac was also awarded the highest score in the school with an amazing 183 out of a possible 200! These seven students will now be invited to the Oxford University Computing Challenge which takes place in February so good luck to them if they choose to take part.
