Message from Becky Ricketts, Deputy Headteacher

It is hard to believe that the half term break is not too far away. The term has flown by and I remain impressed by the adaptability and resilience our students continue to demonstrate.

Autumn has arrived and mornings and nights are become darker. Please can I encourage you to check that your child's bikes are road safe and have a full set of working lights. I would also encourage you to ensure your child is visible on their bikes as well as walking to and from school by having something that is reflective. News from the Global and Historical Faculty

In the History department we have a had a great start to the academic year and are looking forward to welcoming Year 6 to the open evening next week.

This half term our Year 7 classes have settled well and have been enjoying learning about the Battle of Hastings. In Year 8 the students have been getting to grips with the English Civil war and the reasons why England executed the king! Our Year 9 students have just finished learning about the Suffragettes and they have completed some excellent written work analysing their actions and motives. With all of our KS3 students, we have introduced homework that has focused on history and historical events happening in other parts of the world at the same time period that we have been studying in class. Year 7 have been researching medieval Baghdad, Year 8 the rule of Indian princess Nur Jahan in 17th century India and Year 9 have looked at how women got the vote in New Zealand and completed some local history as well about Edith Cavell.

Our Year 10 classes have all made an excellent start to their GCSE course; we have been very impressed with their engagement and hard work. Our Year 11s have been working hard to finish the Superpower Relations and the Cold War work for their period study part of the GCSE.

Our Year 12 students have made a fantastic beginning with their A-level studies and Year 13 have survived mocks and will be working hard over the next half term completing their NEA.
