Message from Becky Ricketts, Deputy Headteacher

Year 11 completed their mock exams and are receiving their eagerly awaited results and feedback this week. It is crucial that they start to follow the 'next steps' feedback if they are to reach their potential in the summer.

Mrs Crane has kindly offered to run some Foundation revision sessions supporting those students trying to achieve a grade 4 or 5 in their exams. They will be on Wednesdays at 3pm in G5. Please check with your teacher to see if they are appropriate for your child; if they are, they just turn up!

Some of our Year 11s, who did incredibly well in their mocks, have been offered the opportunity to take an extra qualification in Maths – Level 2 Further Mathematics. Sessions will be after school on a Wednesday Week 1 & Thursday Week 2 in G2. Don't forget to let their teacher know if your child is interested.

We've had some positive feedback from some of our younger students who have been trying the 'Multiplication Grand Prix' app at home and are starting to see a real improvement in the recall of their times tables. If this is something you feel you could improve, please give it a go!

Hate Crime Awareness Week - It was Hate Crime Awareness between 9th and 16th October 2021. We delivered 15 online sessions for year 6 pupils intended to raise awareness of what hate crime is, the consequences for victims and offenders and where to go for help. We reached 2400 students and had some very positive feedback. One teacher stated the session was "very topical to Black History Month and racism which we have been covering in RSHE".

Anti-Bullying Week: During anti-bullying week, we delivered 8 online sessions, attended by schools in the Great Yarmouth and Broadland areas about online bullying. Children learned about the kinds of behaviour that are considered online bullying and were reminded to always be kind online. Again, we had some lovely feedback with one teacher saying the session was "ageappropriate, telling [children about] the dangers but without being too frightening".

After the success of these sessions, we will continue to adapt and use these resources in schools to complement the PSHE curriculum.



Key Messages – We're pleased to have been able to come back into schools to deliver our key message presentations in person. We're still offering these online where schools are unable to accommodate us in person, however. We have delivered the following topics to over 4950 students between September and December 2021 and we will continue to deliver these sessions over the rest of the academic year: Internet Safety - Year 7

County Lines and Knife Crime - Year 8

Grooming - Year 9

Relationship Abuse - Year 10.

College Presentation: We attended Paston College and piloted a new presentation which covers a number of issues pertinent to young people after they have left school and started college and university. Feedback was really positive and we are looking to extend the offer of this presentation to other colleges in Norfolk.

Online Work Experience – We also piloted an online work experience package which 25 young people attended over the half-term holiday. Students in year 12 were asked to apply for this opportunity and after its successful delivery as a pilot, we will be offering this opportunity again later in the academic year, so watch this space for details of when it is available again.
