
ENGLISH AS AN ADDITIONAL LANGUAGE (EAL) UPDATE

WHAT'S HAPPENING IN...

May sees the arrival of exams and in the maths department we are supporting our Year 11 and Year 13 students as they prepare to complete their final exams. Support from home with simple preparations such as ensuring students have all the correct equipment, eat well and get to bed at a sensible time all make a huge difference. For a GCSE maths exam, students should have black pens, pencils, rubber, ruler, protractor, a pair of compasses and should have a scientific calculator. We recommend the Casio FX-85GTCW, but the students should have been working with their own calculator for the past two years and be confident with the calculator they are familiar with. If you are not sure please do not hesitate to communicate with your child/ward's teacher.

Communication is vital to support our students as they progress from Year 7 through to their GCSE and A-Level examinations. We were delighted to have the opportunity to meet in person with many Year 10 parents in school at parents evening last week. We also welcome parents/carers and students for parent/carer maths sessions – the next is coming up on Thursday 22nd May. If you ever feel that you have any questions or concerns relating to your child's journey in maths, we encourage you to get in touch with us as we are always happy to help. The best email address to use is provided on the bottom of each homework task set on SatchelOne.

Final assessments are also ahead for all students and information relating to these will be published on SatchelOne. Students have been working hard over the year and it will be great to see the progress they have made reflected in their outcomes. It has also been very positive to see students engaging with their starter tasks, where they are gaining a high level of confidence with key skills through regular practice and repetition. If you would like to have a mathematical conversation with your child at home – perhaps they could tell you about the skills they are working on in their starters at the moment, which they complete in the back of their exercise book?

Over the next week or so we will be putting the final touches to the student and parent surveys in order to gain valuable feedback on how well we're doing and where we still need to improve. I know we don't always get everything right, very few organisations with so many human beings involved do, but we are keen to consistently improve and offer a better service to our students and their families, within the constraints that we face, so when the questionnaires come out next week, please do try to find some time to complete them and help us to improve and recognise what you think is successful at our school.

With the weather warming up we've made a few adjustments to our uniform expectations, so I thought it would be sensible to make families aware of these. Between now and the May half term break, student in Years 7 to 9 are expected to wear their blazers between lessons in the corridors but may take them off when they get to their seats in classrooms if they are warm. After the half term break, students can choose if they have their blazer with them. However, if they are bringing a layer to wear over their shirts, it should be their blazer not their jumper please.
