I'll start this week's newsletter with a special mention and thanks to the students and colleagues who weathered the storm – literally and metaphorically – last weekend on the Duke of Edinburgh Bronze expedition to Trimingham. Normally a weekend in June is a safe bet but last weekend brought torrential rain and marble-sized hailstones amongst flashes of sunshine and warmth. It was clearly a real test for our intrepid explorers so well done to all who braved the inclement conditions. We have another silver award group going away this weekend so fingers-crossed for a more typical June experience (or maybe last weekend was typical!).

This week has also seen students in Years 9 and 10 travel to Normandy and surrounding areas to visit a snail farm, see the tomb of William the Conqueror, buy unnecessary quantities of chocolate at a French chocolaterie, see the Bayeux tapestry and learn about the beach landings at Arromanches. To fit all of that into three days is quite a feat and students looked ready for the weekend on Friday having arrived back in Taverham on Thursday evening. My thanks to all families who supported the trip, both in terms of paying for your children/wards to go, but also for sending them into school (potentially against their wishes!) on Friday morning. You may have noted that we have increased the volume of trips, local and further afield, this year as this was something that schools nationally struggled with post-Covid. We are delighted with the range of enriching trips we are currently able to offer, but it can't come at the cost of attendance to school on the days around the trips, so thank you for fighting the good fight and ignoring any pleas of tiredness! My thanks of course to colleagues who made this trip happen – Mrs Turner, Mr Timbers, Mrs Harries and Miss Heydon. It takes a huge amount of time and effort to arrange these trips – especially overseas and residential – and they can cause an awful lot of stress and drag teachers away from their families. It was lovely, therefore, to hear that an ex-teacher member of public stopped Mrs Turner to comment on how incredible our students were being and how well behaved and mature they were – these things make an enormous difference and make the trips much easier to take.

On Tuesday this week, Year 12 students visited the Showground for an introduction to UCAS, the university application portal. We acknowledge that university isn't the right post-18 destination for all students and there are many other worthwhile and interesting options to explore, but university is undoubtedly one of them and therefore this trip was aimed to ensure that all students attending gained an understanding of the process and can make informed decisions about their next steps. Mrs Robertson is working really hard to ensure that students in our sixth form are well informed on all of the options available to them when they leave our sixth form, so look out for more information over the next few months about apprenticeships, degree level apprenticeships and employment opportunities as well as university information.

It's been a busy week for Miss Birkin this week as well, with visits to feeder schools to meet our new Year 7s for September in their current schools and start those important transition conversations with teachers. I know she took ex-students from our current Year 7 back to their old schools to visit and answer student questions. As our best ambassadors it's always important that they offer first hand experience in their answers to questions from their peers as they are best placed to settle any nerves and drum up excitement! Miss Birkin also took a group of our female footballers to lead a community football event on Friday – something they have planned and delivered themselves. We're really proud of how well this group of students have worked together to put on this event and I look forward to hearing how successful it was on Monday.

Thursday evening saw our last parents' evening event of the academic year with Year 7 parents/carers joining online. As ever, a fantastic turn out and great engagement from this cohort. It's little wonder the Year 7s are such a brilliant year group with such engaged and interested parents/carers.

Finally, along with the end of external exams, the next few weeks are busy with Year 9 students undertaking English spoken language endorsement presentations from next week then Year 10s undertaking their mock exams the week after.
