What will I need for my first day?

- A refillable water bottle.
- A suitable bag for your books and other equipment.
- Basic stationary such as pen, pencil, ruler, eraser in a pencil case.
- Snack / lunch from home if you are not purchasing from the canteen.

If you are using the canteen, you will need to set up your cashless account on the WisePay App where your parents / carers can pay money in. Once your account has credit in it, you 'pay' for your food using your fingerprint. It is so easy!
