



- Charity work culminating in RAG week.








# **Character & Culture**


Lessons are only half of the learning time for post 16 courses.

You will also have Independent Study time to support your studies for nine hours a fortnight per subject.

You should complete 1 hour outside lesson

for every hour inside lesson!

This allows flexibility so you can work at school and later at home in the way that best suits you.

- Headphones or mobiles only in the Sixth Form Centre.




#### **Supporting Wellbeing**
