## WHY IS ENRICHMENT IMPORTANT?

- **596,590** UCAS applications were made in Jan 2023 (UCAS.com, June 2023)
- **275,630** apprenticeship starts in 2022/23 – with **27,340** apprenticeship starts in the East of England Region (government statistics service)
- Those entering the workplace **lack** interpersonal skills, confidence and motivation, critical thinking, innovation and creative thinking. (Deloitte Millennial Survey, 2018)
- It is our responsibility to ensure you are equipped to be successful when leaving school.

## WHAT DOES 'ENRICHMENT' LOOK LIKE AT TAVERHAM 6<sup>TH</sup> FORM?

- 2 hours a fortnight of timetabled activities
- Community based opportunities – both inside and outside school
- Guest speakers from different career paths
- One day events and visits to help inform your choices following Sixth Form
- Work Experience Week
- Subject specific trips

## TIMETABLED PROGRAMME

- *£10 Young Enterprise Challenge* – working as part of a team you will create and pitch your idea to leadership to win £10, spending the money to make/sell the product/service. After repaying the £10 investment, 50% of the profit is donated to the RAG week charity and 50% is kept by students.
- *Extended Project Qualification* – develop a project on any topic you like to gain an accredited qualification
- *Film Club* – watch and critique different directors, genres and time periods
- *Financial Trading Club* - learn to trade all sorts of financial instruments without risk through a virtual account, competing with others to make the most money (prizes for winners!)
- *Grub on a Grant* – cooking skills and meal preparation
- *Health and Well-being* – a sports and exercise opportunity to have a go at familiar, as well as more obscure, sports to improve health and well-being during your studies

## COMMUNITY BASED PROJECTS

- *Classroom Support* – support a subject/subjects of your choice in lower school
- *Lower School Mentoring* – in areas such as revision support, reading buddies
- *Lunchtime Club* – do you have an interest that you would like to share with lower school?
- *Community Support* – volunteering opportunities with Norfolk Museums Service, local care homes and local community groups
- *Broadland Youth Advisory Board* – space for young people to voice opinions, run campaigns and decide how funding is spent
