TIMETABLED PROGRAMME

- Extended Project Qualification* develop a project on any topic you like to gain an accredited qualification
- Core Mathematics designed to develop real-life mathematical skills, supporting other subjects such as geography, business, economics and psychology
- Film Club watch and critique different directors, genres and time periods
- Grub on a Grant cooking skills and meal preparation for when you leave home
- Health and Well-being a sports and exercise opportunity to have a go at familiar, as well as more obscure, sports to improve health and well-being during your studies. Trips out for external activities will entail costs.
- MFL an opportunity to develop European cultural awareness and language skills



COMMUNITY BASED PROJECTS

- Classroom Support support a subject/subjects of your choice in lower school classes; YII revision support
- Paired Reading listening to a KS3 student (usually Y7/Y8 who needs a little bit more support), read once a week. You will help to ignite an enjoyment of reading and is a great opportunity to act as a mentor to lower school students and make a real difference.
- Lunchtime Club setting up and running a lunchtime club for lower school students in an area of personal interest
- Community Support volunteering opportunities with Norfolk Museums Service, local care homes and local community groups
- Gold Duke of Edinburgh Award a long term project involving helping the community/environment, becoming fitter, planning and completing an expedition and team working on a residential activity
- Independently organised volunteering e.g. wildlife opportunities
