

## INDEPENDENT STUDY – Preparation Consolidation Reflection

Remember you should be studying one hour independently for every hour of lesson time. In your independent study periods, once homework and assignments are complete, you should complete tasks from the following list:

## Preparation

- Refer to your curriculum overview and read the next section in the textbook and make notes to get familiar with the material for the next few lessons
- Complete wider reading from History journals (check wider reading log, @historyTHS on Twitter, online and 6th form library for suggestions e.g. Modern History Review or History Extra) on upcoming topics.



- Use your textbooks for each unit to go over the recent topic and complete tasks from the books
- Use your wider reading log to find suitable resources to study. Keep updating your wider reading log
- Access the PowerPoints and resources in your classroom in Teams to increase your understanding of the current topics

## Consolidation

- Read over your notes from last lesson and type them up or make a revision card on that topic
- Take a returned essay, read the comments, and then have a second go
- Use your textbook and the library / internet to add to your class notes from the last lesson
- Organise your folder. Ensure all work is in order and up to date
- Find a suitable exam question from the textbook, revision guides or online (see exam board website) and answer it

## Reflection

- Use Seneca to complete the online quizzes on earlier topics to keep this information fresh OR use recall fact sheets (e.g. Tudor 100 questions sheets) to prepare for knowledge tests.
- Make revision mind maps or flashcards to test your knowledge on previous learning
- Use the Revision Guides provided to complete the activities within them to support your learning
- Complete additional questions from past papers or the various guides
- Make a glossary of key words or fact file of key people or ideas
