



1) Help for families who need support during the Coronavirus crisis

The Government announced on Sunday that it would be helping thousands of people across the country who need help getting supplies of food and medicines and who may need other support.

If somebody that you live with has a serious health issue, are aged over 70 and / or are self-isolating and are unable to leave the house, there is help in your community available. Help is also available if your family are eligible to receive free school meals.

This help has been in put in place to help shield people who may be at high risk to Coronavirus.

Help is available to arrange deliveries of emergency food supplies, medicines and collect prescriptions for you, as well as support you in other ways such as offering parenting help.
